Sir,

I am directed to say that **Shri Anoop Badhwa , IFS(MH:84)** has been selected for appointment on deputation to the post of **Inspector General of Forests in MoEF** under the Central Staffing Scheme of the Ministry of Environment & Forests on the following terms and conditions:

- (i) He will draw pay as per the scale allowed by the Cadre Controlling Authority plus Central Deputation Allowance as applicable to that grade.
- (ii) The appointment will be on deputation basis for a period of five years. The period of deputation is liable to be curtailed by the appointing authority at its discretion without assigning any reason and without notice. The officer stands repatriated to the parent cadre on completion of the tenure of deputation.
- (iii) The headquarters of the post will be at Delhi but the services of the officer can be utilized anywhere in India.
- (iv) Other terms and conditions will be the same as applicable to the other officers of his grade on deputation to the Central Government.

2. The State Government is requested that **Shri Anoop Badhwa , IFS(MH:84)** may be relieved from his current assignment to enable him to join the above post at the earliest.
